Plagiarism of Paperwork

(i.e. lab report, individual project, thesis)

2. Consequences of plagiarism: failing of the course! (accordind to the Academic Regulations at the WUT, § 19 p. 4., new version 1.10.2019):

"If during the verification of learning outcomes achievement, it is established that the student works with external assistance or uses materials or devices unauthorised by the course regulations, the student shall be awarded a fail grade and shall lose the right to pass the course being currently pursued."
3. In case of teamwork all authors meet the consequences. No investigation who is the leading author responsible. All co-authors are equally responsible.
4. To avoid plagiarism:
 - work on your own! It is much better to deliver weak report than the copy of other report,
 - when using information from other sources always cite the source and rephrase the original work, avoid direct quoting.

Basic Regulations

regarding lectures, tests and exams



1. It is not allowed to register / record lectures, laboratory courses, training by audiovisual means (video, voice, photos) without permission of the teacher.
2. **Breaking regulations mentioned below results in failing the test/exam:**
 - Bring your student identity card to tests and put it on the table.
 - Be on time. People who are late disturb the others and therefore will not be admitted.
 - Write your test on your own: use only materials permitted by the examiner (if any).
 - Use of any electronic devices (including smartwatches) is prohibited.
 - It is not allowed to communicate with other people.
